## **About Protea**

The Proteaceae family of plants is comprised of over 1,400 species, of which the Protea genus contains 150. The name Protea is derived from the Greek god, Proteus, who was able to change into many different forms. These colorful flowers range in size from two to twelve inches in diameter. They were discovered several centuries ago in South Africa, where they still thrive. They are now being grown in California, which has become a major producer. Today, California growers supply the world with the most popular and beautiful blooms from the Protea, Banksia, Leucospermum and Leucadendron genera.

California provides the full sun, well-drained slopes, air circulation, mild winters and an acid soil in which most of these plants fare best. Protea bloom during autumn, winter and spring, with several varieties such as the King and Banksia blooming through summer.

Due to their sturdy structure, these flowers travel well. They are particularly long-lasting in opulent floral displays. All the Protea, Leucadendron and Banksia genera dry naturally and easily with no special handling. These permanent arrangements will continue to give pleasure a long time to come.
